


# **Barefoot Experience**

Chat with the grandmas on the porch of a home

The history and lifestyle of the people of Taketomi Island is in the heart of the traditional folktales and folk songs of the island. Sit on the porch and listen to a local grandma talk while she mixes in some of the island's dialect

aketomi Island, which is approximately 9.2km in periphery, is an island that has developed its own distinct history and culture, cherishing the worship of nature and a faith paying respect to the ancestors, which are practices that have been handed down for generations since ancient times. The red-tiled roofing, the stone walls made by piling up coral reefs, and the Fukugi trees which have been planted for the protection from the wind and tides. This beautiful stillness has been preserved and inherited in the form of a national park.

The barefoot experience is a program in which you can leisurely walk around the island with "Oji" and "Oba" as tour guides, visiting various sacred places called "Utaki" and treasure collection museums where you can find tools and folk art materials used by the local people. In one of these programs you can sit on a porch of one of the local homes and hear stories about the island while chatting with the local people. A sandy path where you can feel the wisdom and beautiful lifestyle of the local people runs through the villages, so try walking on the path with your bare feet and experience the touch of the sand.



# Looking at the history and customs at Kihouin Collection Center

The Kihouin Collection Center is a historical and cultural collection center of Taketomi Island and was built directly next to Japan's southern-most temple. The center has about 4000 items on display, which were collected by priests: tools, arts and crafts, and valuable historical documents from the "Jintouzei" period. Learn about the history of the



The textiles and pottery that are made from natural ingredients and traditional handcrafted glass. Try using your hands while enjoying talking to the people of the island.





Ishigaki Island with a periphery of 75km, has the second largest area next to mainland Okinawa. 90% of that land is a mountainous region covered with subtropical primeval forests and several animals and plants including the "Iriomote Wildcat", a special national treasure, have been identified as valuable treasury by the national park. With such vast nature as a background the "Iriomote School" has been opened in the eastern and western regions. The eastern region is where you can enjoy visiting the Nakama River which proudly has the largest mangrove

In the western region, the largest river in Okinawa, the "Urauchi River", 17.5km long, and beyond this the Mariyudo Waterfall and the Kanpire Waterfall can be seen. Each school, which is surrounded by its distinct natural environment and lifestyle, provides a variety of programs including the "Nature Experience", the "Cultural Experience", and the "Agricultural Experience".

Take a bath in the Forest

Learn how to cook authentic Okinawan food from the local people using such vegetables as Fuchiba (Mugwort), Green Papaya, Shima Rakkyou (Island Shallot) and ingredients that you can get from the ocean such as Aosa and Mozuku, You can learn how to make such dishes as "Fuchiba Soba", "Yushi Dofu" and "Sataandagi", dishes that may be great for when







nong the 19 islands of Yaeyama, large and small, Ishigaki Island which holds 80% of its population, is the island which serves as the center of politics, economy and culture of the Yaeyama archipelago. Although it has added some urban facilities to increase the accessibility to the neighboring islands of Taketomi and Iriomote, once you go past the city, there is nothing but beautiful greenery that spreads across the land. In the central region of the island is the highest mountain in Okinawa, "Omotodake", in the northern region is the "Hirakubo Peninsula". a range of green hills jutting out into the Pacific Ocean, and in the western region are a number of scenic sites such as "Kabira Bay", a lookout point that is known as a culturing spot for Black Pearl. In such a way, a superb landscape meshed by nature on the island, spreads across the land.

The challenge in such an island, Ishigaki, is the "Slow Food Program", a program in which you can learn about the healthy food of the island by actually trying to farm, fish, and cook on the island. Go out on a fishing boat with a local fisherman a try to catch some fish, or enjoy harvesting Goya in a Goya field with some local farmers while working up a sweat. Then, with the fresh ingredients, you can be taught how to make numerous Okinawan dishes which are known as "Chojyu Shoku", food that is known as the secret to longevity.

Complete your journey by looking up at the stars of the beautifully clear evening skies, to make this an unforgettable experience.





# The Fishing Experience

In Ishigaki where fishing thrives, there are currently about seventy "Sabani" fishing boats out at sea. Get on a Sabani boat that real fisherman steer and try to catch some fish. Sometimes you can catch Moray or Swellfish, fish that you may not ordinarily see at your supermarket. In addition you can experience dynamic fishing such as Payao and Tuna fishing.





# The Farming and Cooking Experience

At places such as Kabira, in Ishigaki City and Taketomi Town, on Iriomote Island, you can experience harvesting sugar cane all year round. From December through April, enjoy making brown sugar using traditional Japanese firewood stoves. At Kabira's sightseeing sugarcane plantation, experience making mochi (rice cakes) with akaimo (Okinawan purple sweet potato)—enjoying the sweet fragrance as it's steamed with getto

In addition to the fact that Yaeyama, which is in Japan's southern-most point, has more constellations visible here than any other region of Japan, it is also possible to view some of the most beautifully clear evening skies without any effects of the westerly winds. 
In addition, in November there is a sugarcane harvest that most of the men and women of the island participate. Experience making fresh juice and brown sugar with the sugarcane that you harvested.

onaguni Island, which is located in the western-most point of Japan, being only 111 kilometers from Taiwan, is truly an island that is on the country border. Kuroshio currents flow in the neighboring waters and it is known as a great fishing point where you can catch large migratory fish such as swordfish and tuna. It is said that you do not have to be a fishing enthusiast to be able to catch something and it is possible for even a beginner to catch a fish that is over 100kg in weight. Fishing is one of the great pleasures that you can enjoy on Yonaguni Island.

In addition the Yonaguni Horse, a special natural treasure that grazes on the vast meadow, is a great tourist attraction. Because it is friendly and quite small, children can also enjoy its company. Also try experiencing the "Yonaguniori", a textile which is made by making geometrical designs with threads of very splendid colors.





This island, which is known as the best Swordfish fishing snot in Okinawa is only a 15 minute boat ride from Pavao. If you make a reservation in advance, even a novice can experience catching fish any time of the year, like bonito tun a or coelacanth

# Live in the footsteps of "Mr. Cow"

Kuro Island, which floats approximately 19 kilometers southwest of Ishigaki Island on top of the transparent blue ocean, is mostly an island of cow pastures. Compared to the island population of 232, there are 3042 cows on the island. Beyond the Kuro Island Fishing Port, a paradise for the cows grazing under the radiant sun spreads across. The continuous pastoral scenery of the land is what brings out the kindness in all of the visitors.

# A trip looking up at the sun and the starry night


This island, which long ago was called "Hate No Uruma" (an island of coral reefs at the far end), is somewhat separated from the neighboring islands by rough water currents. Quite contrary to the rough waters of the ocean, the red tiled roofs surrounded by stone walls and the Fukugi trees which block the sunlight, provide a surprisingly tranquil atmosphere to the island. And when the sun goes down, you can enjoy a spectacular view of stars and from winter to spring, a constellation known as the "Southern Cross", shines brightly on the island.




# Seasonal Traditions
